- C Major (C)
- D Major (D)

- D Major (D)
- E Major (E)



How to Play These Songs

- 1. Learn the Chords Practice transitioning smoothly between the three chords used in each song.
- 2. Strumming Patterns Experiment with different rhythms to match the original song.
- Sing Along Many of these songs are great for singing along while playing.
- 4. Use a Capo Some songs may sound better in a different key; using a capo allows you to play the same chord shapes but in a higher pitch.

With these 25 songs, you have a fantastic starting point for playing the guitar with just three simple chords.
